## Faculty:

**Amy J. Elliott, Ph.D.**, is a Senior Scientist, Director of the Health Disparities Research Center at Sanford Research/USD and Vice Chair of Research in the Department of Pediatrics at the Sanford School of Medicine at the University of South Dakota. She received her doctorate degree in Child Clinical Psychology from Western Michigan University and completed her internship and fellowship in Behavioral Pediatrics and Genetics at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Dr. Elliott is the Principal Investigator for the Safe Passage Study Northern Plains Comprehensive Clinical Sites, a large longitudinal study designed to investigate the relationship between prenatal alcohol exposure and fetal and infant mortality. Dr. Elliott has laboratory sites in Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Pine Ridge, and Cape Town, South Africa.

**Kathleen Tavenner Mitchell, MHS, LCADC** is currently the Vice President and National Spokesperson for the National Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and a noted international speaker on Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) and Women and Addictions. Ms. Mitchell is a licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselor (LCADC), has a Master of Human Services (MHS) degree and twenty-four years of experience as a national educator, clinician, and lecturer. She was appointed to the National Task Force on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome/Fetal Alcohol Effects by the Secretary of Health and Human Services. She is a faculty member of the Medical Ethics and Humanities Program at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine and the Georgetown University School of Medicine, Department of Family Medicine Selective. She has authored several papers and *Fetal Alcohol Syndrome; a Guidebook for Parents and Caregivers*, and co-authored *Making a Difference: Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Public Awareness Guide*. Ms. Mitchell supervised the development of FASD prevention curricula for students K-12 and developed an FASD curriculum for addiction professionals and other allied health professionals. She co-founded the *Circle of Hope*, an international program for birth mothers of children with FASD. She has testified to the United States House of Representatives on behalf of several bills, and worked with a writer of *NBC's Law and Order; Special Victims Unit* to create a show about FASD.
